Study Rooms Coming Soon to Moyer

A construction project begins at Moyer this week. Moyer's staff and Board heard your requests for private, quiet work spaces. After much discussion and planning, we are thrilled to share that we are installing two study rooms. They will be located in the southeast corner of Moyer. The rooms will be 10X10 feet to accommodate both individuals and small groups. More room details and usage policies will be shared in the coming weeks.

This project allows us to merge our local history books with our local history items. We're creating a Ford County history space at Moyer. Displays and local history research materials will be placed together.

The Moyer District Library Book Club meets the first Thursday of each month at 1:00PM. In April, they are meeting at Hollybrook. The Art Thief: A True Story of Love, Crime, and a Dangerous Obsession by Michael Finkel is their book choice.

From the OPAC: "For centuries, works of art have been stolen in countless ways from all over the world, but no one has been quite as successful at it as the master thief Stephane Breitwieser. Carrying out more than two hundred heists over nearly ten years--in museums and cathedrals all over Europe--Breitwieser, along with his girlfriend who worked as his lookout, stole more than three hundred objects, until it all fell apart in spectacular fashion.

Unlike most thieves, he never stole for money, keeping all his treasures in a single room where he could admire them to his heart's content. Possessed of a remarkable athleticism and an innate ability to assess practically any security system, Breitwieser managed to pull off a breathtaking number of audacious thefts. Yet these strange talents bred a growing disregard for risk and an addict's need to score, leading Breitwieser to ignore his girlfriend's pleas to stop--until one final act of hubris brought everything crashing down."

the book may be checked out at Moyer. It is also available both as an ebook and audiobook on the library app Libby.
